**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act investing in public higher education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 (e) of chapter 32A of the General Laws, as appearing in the
2 2016 Official Edition, is hereby amended in line 117 by inserting after the word “hours” the
3 following: - “; or a faculty member who teaches the equivalent of at least two three or more-
4 credit courses per semester, or four three or more- credit courses per calendar year at one or more
5 of the public institutions of higher education in the state, as set forth in section 5 of chapter 15A,
6 including a division of continuing education, regardless of funding source, including but not
7 limited to subsidiary account CC, and regardless of the term of employment or participation or
8 membership in a retirement system or plan; provided, that the commonwealth, not the public
9 higher education institutions, shall bear the cost.”
